

Ph.D. Mentor

Each student in the Ph.D. program, by the end of 9 hours of course work (per the Graduate Bulletin), is required to have a Ph.D. mentor. Students and mentor enter into this relationship by mutual consent, but the process needs to be initiated by the student. Students are expected to consult with their mentors regularly about their intellectual, scholarly, and professional development.

Mentor and Doctoral Advisory/Dissertation Committee (History Department)

*A mentor must be named after 9 hours of course work. Normally, the mentor will be the graduate faculty member in the Department whose research and teaching interests most closely correspond to those of the student. Prospective mentors must agree to serve and be approved by the Graduate Committee. **Mentors will be responsible for the pedagogical, scholarly, and professional development of their students during their program of study, will chair their Doctoral Advisory/Dissertation Advisory Committee, and will direct the student's dissertation.***

All students are required to identify a mentor and to obtain his/her willingness to serve by completing the form below. This form must be returned to the Director of Graduate Studies.
