Steven Beller, *Antisemitism; A Very Short History* (2007) This book will be used later in discussion later the semester, after research projects are well underway.

Paper Requirements: A research paper of ca. 25 pages will be required at the end of the semester. The research topic is to be selected in conjunction with and the agreement of the seminar director. Turabian will provide the style for references, bibliography, etc.

Discussion Requirements: We are scheduled to meet weekly. The first few meetings will be largely devoted to general considerations of antisemitism. based upon the Perry and Schweitzer book and the problems related to defining a clear and manageable research topic. After that progress reports on individual research which in turn will provide the basis for general discussion. Contributions to and participation in these discussion is absolutely essential.

When seminar members are fully engaged in their research projects we may have occasion to skip a weekly meeting or so.

Grading Scale: The quality of the research and writing in the final paper will account for ca. 80% of the course grade. Participation in discussion will account for the remaining 20 %.

Deadlines: Deadlines for outlines, first drafts, final papers will be determined once the semester is underway. Some of you will be doing your comprehensive examination and I want to leave some “open time” for that.
