Bulletin Description: History of North Carolina from its colonial origins to the twentieth century, including the evolution of its political system, economy, social structure, and culture.

Course Description: This course explores the history of North Carolina from the period before European colonization through the twentieth century. In this course, students will investigate the roles people of various backgrounds played in the development of North Carolina. Topics covered in this course include Colonization, Revolution, Slavery, Politics, Policy, Civil War, Reconstruction, Jim Crow, and Civil Rights.

Student Learning Outcomes:

- Demonstrate a thorough and solid knowledge of North Carolina History. Students should know events, people, and major issues under consideration and be able to communicate this knowledge.
- Connect events in sequence, recognize cause and effect, and pinpoint change over time.
- Discern and explore the natures, means of interpretation, and biases within original historical source materials and later scholarly interpretations and understand how these distinctions can further their understanding of the human story.
- Recognize the rudimentary issues of historiography in the period and understand how changing questions influence these schools of thought.
- Construct a basic argument on the historical issues of the period and support the argument appropriately.
